Is Pegasus spyware targeting journalists in India?

🕵 Amnesty International and The Washington Post alleged ongoing use of the Pegasus spyware, targeting journalists in India, including Siddharth Varadarajan and Anand Mananale.

Amnesty's Security Lab found traces of Pegasus on their devices, allegedly installed via a "zero-click exploit." requiring no action from the device owner.

The exploit, named "BLASTPAST," involves attempting to link with Apple HomeKit and sending malicious content via iMessage.

Right NSO, Pegasus's maker, claimed vetting its technology only for law enforcement agencies fighting crime, denying targeting journalists or non-criminal individuals

In 2021, the 'Pegasus Project' highlighted potential surveillance of journalists and officials in India.

A Supreme Court committee examined the allegations, with the government reportedly not cooperating, and activists petitioned the Court, alleging mass surveillance.

Connected Lending

- The RBI's recent announcement outlines plans to establish a unified regulatory framework concerning 'Connected Lending' (CL) for entities under its regulation.
- (Connected Lending' refers to the extension of credit to individuals or firms linked through ownership or control, including direct or indirect ownership, exertion of control, or familial and group ties.
